Article submission guidelines

All articles, of no more than 15 pages, should be submitted in triplicate, double spaced, clearly printed and available on computer disk. All reference material must be fully documented. In order to verify accuracy of sources, articles must be accompanied by the following: a. For direct quotes and all references from books, a photocopy of the copyright page, which includes the publishing information, and a photocopy of any quoted material. b. For direct quotes and all references from periodicals, photocopies of the title page of the periodical, publishing information, and photocopies of the first and last pages of the article and of any original quoted material. Articles which are not accompanied by reference information will not be considered. Please include a brief author's biography. Articles must comply with the JPOP style sheet which may be requested from the Journal. All articles submitted for publication become the property of the Journal. Be sure to keep a copy: we cannot return hard copies or computer disks. All ownership rights revert to the author after publication.

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What is process work?
